From Pastor Phil

April Showers Bring May Flowers

When I was growing up, every spring people would trot out that old saying, "April showers bring May flowers". The rainy days are necessary for the blossoming of color that announces the coming of spring and the onset of summer.

Paul, in a more profound way wrote something similar: ¹⁶ Therefore we do not lose heart. Though outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day. ¹⁷ For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all. ¹⁸ So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen, since what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal.

The secret to not losing heart (not giving way to despair in hard times), according to Paul is to not become fixated upon our current situation, whatever that may be, but to remain focused on the foundation that doesn't crumble and the promises that do not disappoint. Specifically the hope (which in Biblical language means certainty) we have in the death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus Christ.

Paul wasn't saying we should be naïve about troubles in the world, or to ignore them. He had tremendous challenges and difficult circumstances in his ministry that he lays out in some of his letters. But he understood that all these hard things were temporary, even death.

The Christian poet, George Herbert, wrote these lines of defiance even in the face of death speaking to death in the hope of Christ:

Spare not, do thy worst.
I shall be one day better than before;
Thou so much worse,
that thou shalt be no more.

"He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be **no more death**' or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away."

Renovation Team Update: We are nearing agreement on a design that would enable us to shift all activity to the 170 West Davis facility within the budget imposed by our available funds. The classroom and worship center wings will be delayed until more resources are provided. We will have a multi-purpose room, a kitchen, handicap accessible restrooms, a conference room, and a fellowship nook. We are also looking at sealing the roof, exterior siding, and possible underground connection to electric. Some of the construction drawings required for permits and bids are already in progress. The remainder will be completed after finalizing details for certain portions of the facility.

Facility Update: Plans are being developed to remove the stumps and brush behind the facility at 170 West Davis as well as grading and stoning the parking lot. For safety and use of the proper equipment we are negotiating this work with local contractors. Funding will be taken from the building fund. We believe by handling this task separately from the rest of the renovation we can realize savings toward the overall project.

behind a fellowship composed completely of new Christians. Concerned for the survival and health of this vulnerable fellowship, Paul sent his protégé Timothy to investigate. The report was better than expected. While still working through the challenges of being new to the faith even as they were persecuted, the fellowship stood strong. These letters reveal how Paul helped them address many of the changes of learning to live as a follower of Jesus. Our facility is not to meet our needs for a place (although it will), it is a place for our neighbors to gather with us for many different reasons and a home base for us to reach out to our neighbors – to the best possible neighbors to them.

How well do you know our new neighborhood? Some suggestions:



Drive the streets of the Northwest Tiffin neighborhood. Learn the layout. Learn the street names. Locate businesses, parks, churches, schools, or other landmarks. Get a feel for the neighborhood. Cover

as much of it as possible. Get off the main streets and cruise the residential streets.



Take a walk. Being on foot allows you to see, hear, and even smell details you miss when you are in a car. Pick a safe place to park. Take a stroll around that part of the neighborhood. If you get the chance, say hello to one of our new neighbors.

Maybe have a conversation with them. Make sure you listen to them to get to know them more than you talk about yourself or the church.



Sit in a park on a weekend. Pick out a nice day and find a table or bench from which to soak in the sun and watch the neighborhood go by. Check out who else is using the park. What age groups? What activities? Even if no one is there, think

about how this park might be a place for us to interact with neighbors or help make the neighborhood a better place.

Vision Team Highlights

- Pastor's Report Pastor Phil: Pastor Phil submitted his report before the meeting (previously distributed).
- Finance Mike Cholodewitsch: Mike was unable to attend, but he did submit his report:

He has been gathering information regarding phone, cell phone and internet rates. He has been in contact with both Verizon and Spectrum. He has been told we can keep our current phone number. He is waiting on one piece of information from Verizon before the finance committee makes any decisions.

Shirley is in Florida; therefore, a financial report is not available.

The finance committee has decided not to contact any lenders until we have a better estimate for renovations.

Paperwork has been initiated to convert the stock options that were gifted to the church. Shirley will update me when she returns from her vacation.

• Facilities - Tom Nahm: Pastor Phil reported that the exit door crash bar has been fixed. Also, the new copier has been installed and is now easier to operate.

Nothing will be done on the HVAC systems at this time.

Tom reported that he had two companies look at the future parking lot at West Davis. The land needs to be graded so stone can be added. Tom will request written estimates.

• Worship - Kathy Falter: Kathy reported that people have volunteered to read during the Lenten services and it has gone well. Pastor Phil said that was one of Jim Vassar's goals - get more people to read during worship services.

Peggy Moerdyk has readers for the Maundy Thursday service.

Pastor Phil reported there will be an ecumenical Good Friday service at First Presbyterian.

• Spiritual Development - Melissa Jameson: Melissa reported that the adult Sunday School started a new series entitled "The Mission of Jesus."

Peggy Moerdyk and Linda Grover have activities for the kids up to Easter.

There were nine women at the last Women of Faith meeting. Peggy Moerdyk and Beth Nahm gave a presentation about GriefShare. Afterward, we put together

snack bags and Mary Lou Traxler gave neck and shoulder massages. Melissa reached out to Hope's Landing for our April meeting, but hasn't heard from them. Pastor said that he would contact the lady in charge.

• Congregational Care - Dave Murray: Dave reported that the soup luncheons and suppers have been going well. He talked to Linda Grover for what type of help she may need for the Mother's Day brunch.

Dave needs a list of the shut-ins and who is visiting them. Kathy A. will get him that list.
